IT'S SHOPPING HEAVEN. AMY FALLON KEEPS AN EYE OUT FOR SOME SUPER RESIDENTS ON A WALKING TOUR OF NOTTING HILL IN LONDON

IT'S a rainy London day and I'm standing on a leafy residential street in Notting Hill, excitedly peeking through bushes to get a glimpse of the barbie area of a house. "Elle's home, built in the 1850s, includes a cinema, gym, wine cellar, six bedrooms, library, study, first-floor drawing room and a formal dining room," tour guide Tim Oberg tells me, referring to the supermodel owner, The Body. I'm hanging on to his every word.

The Hollywood must-do – a sightseeing tour of celebrity homes, haunts and other iconic places – is now being run in London by Celebrity Planet. Since they launched in May, they've had more than 1000 bookings.

The W11 postcode is dotted with historic landmarks, such as the former home of author George Orwell, and Hotel Samarkand – just a stone's throw from Elle's pad, which is on the market for \$14.5 million – where Jimi Hendrix died in mysterious circumstances in 1970.

The area, home to the famous Portobello Market, also offers so many irresistible boutiques that it's not hard to see why the Notting Hill set are so well dressed. On Westbourne Grove is Sienna Miller's Twenty8Twelve boutique. The actress started the label with designer sister
