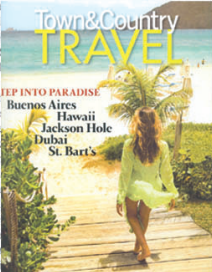

Shop 1, Queens Ct., 118 Queen St.; 011-61-2-9327-2999. For a coffee fix and people-watching, drop by **Bills Woollahra**, the latest venture from celebrated restaurateur Bill Granger. A smartly
